EXPLANATION

- 1. Number '1' should be fewer members instead of less. Therefore "A" is the correct choice.
- 2. There should be on Maple Street instead of in Maple Street. Therefore "C" is correct choice

PROBLEM SOLVING

Time: 20 Minute

Items: 25

DIRECTION: Solve each of the following problems, then indicate the correct answer on the answer sheet by darkening either the block **A**, **B**, **C**, **D**, **E**

Q.1 35% of a number is 14. What is the number?

Solution: Here 35/100 of the number is 14.

The number = $100/35 \times 14 = 40$

A = 42, B=58, C=45, D=40 E none of these

Q.2 I bought a house for Rs. 160 and sold it for Rs. 200. What percent did I gain?

Solution: On Rs. 160 I gained Rs. 200-Rs. 160 = 40

On Rs. One I gained Rs. 40/160.

On Rs. 100 I gained Rs. $40/160 \times 100 = 25\%$

A = 20, B = 25, C = 45, D = 32, E none of these

Q.3 A man earns Rs. 450 in a month and spends 85% of his income. What does he save?

Solution: He spends 85% of Rs. ______%

Which is equal to $85/100 \times Rs. 45 = Rs. 382 (1/2)$

He saves Rs. 450- Rs. 382(1/2) = Rs. 67(1/2) = 67.50

A = 57.50, B = 47.50, C = 67.50, D = 50.67 E none of these

Q.4 In ten years the population of a town increased form 59375 to 61750, find the percentage of the increase?

Solution : The total increase = 61750 - 59375 = 2375

Population of 59375 increase by 2375.

Population as 100 increase by $(2375 \times 100) / 59375 = 4$

Thus the increase is 4%

A = 3%, B = 2%, C = 1.5%, D = 4% E none of these

All items in this part of the test include problem solving sums and quick mathematics. You are to begin only when the Instructor says so, and you must stop writing when the Instructor says, "stop". For all rough work you may use the blank sheet provided with the answer sheet.
